DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. Remembering & Celebration

Sunday, January 17, 2021

This 3rd Sunday in January, may we remember and celebrate the life and work of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

One way we, United Methodist, do this is through observing Human Relations Day. It is an opportunity to recognize that Jesus is not staying behind the walls of the church building.

Among the many lessons we've learned during the pandemic is that even when United Methodist churches must close their doors to physical worship gatherings, we continue to partner with God in ministry. Jesus is at work in our communities, building relationships that may seem unlikely and that transform hearts, minds and spirits. Our congregation's Human Relations Day offerings join with those of other United Methodist churches to connect and build up new realities that reflect God's desire for wholeness.

In this season of epiphany, we read and sing "When the Song of the Angels is Stilled," a setting by composer Elizabeth Alexander of Howard Thurman's poem "The Work of Christmas."

"Howard Thurman (1899-1981) was raised by his grandmother, who had been enslaved. In 1925, he became an ordained Baptist minister. He was dean of chapel at Howard University and later became the dean of chapel at Boston University, the first black chapel dean in a majority-white university in the United States. Co-founder of the first major U.S. interracial, interdenominational congregation, Thurman's theology of radical nonviolence shaped a generation of civil rights activists.

Thurman mentored Dr. King, and this poem strongly evokes their mutual life callings. Thurman's powerful text extends the story of Christmas beyond the birth of Christ to include a call for social justice action by Christ followers. "When the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins:

The Work of Christmas

When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and the princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flocks,
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,

When the song of the angels is stilled,

To bring peace among brothers, To make music in the heart.
